# Highlights From The Last Half Ferm

#### Gilbert White Visit

Year 6 donned their wellies and headed off to the Gilbert White Centre to enhance their current learning about rivers. When we first arrived at the centre, the children wowed the instructors with their already existing knowledge of the different features of rivers. They then carried out a variety of activities including building a model of a river using nature; orienteering using bearings and most excitingly getting in the river. Whilst they were in the river, the children explored looking at the levels from riverbank to riverbank; measuring the velocity (speed) with an apple race and exploring what creatures lived in the river.

The children thoroughly enjoyed this visit and the centre staff commented on how brilliant they were and had such lovely manners.





### Climate Unity Conference

The Federation joined schools from all over Hampshire for the first ever massed learning focussed on Climate Unity, all classes (including our newest Ducklings class) shared the wonderful book 'The Crown' by Emily Kapff to get us thinking about our world as it is now and how we would like it to be. There were workshops from the David Shepherd Foundation and the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust which were thought provoking and fun, especially crafting elephant friendly ways of protecting crops

(please ask your child for more information!).







#### Police Visit

In October, Y6 and Y5 pupils were visited by two police officers from the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Constabulary to learn about on-line safety. Each class had an hours interactive presentation which covered on-line gaming, using the internet, smart phone safety, social media and the law. The children were very engaged in the sessions and asked lots of questions; some were also able to give good advice in response to questions about safety. Parents/guardians were sent a guidance sheet, from the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Constabulary, that covers the topics discussed; the same document is attached to the newsletter for parents/guardians of younger children who are interested in knowing more about how to support safe on-line activity for their children.

## Nursery Rhyme Day

In Year R, we have been focusing on the topic of nursery rhymes for most of this half term and our dress up day is a day where we consolidate and celebrate all of our learning on this topic. Throughout the half term, the children have focused on a different rhyme each week and we have deepened their learning through each rhyme by focusing on key literacy objectives such as listening skills and exploring new vocabulary, rhyming words, alliteration as well as identifying how many syllables in words. We have also developed the children's learning in other areas of curriculum through this topic by linking in opportunities for maths, physical development, understanding the world, and expressive arts and design. The children have really enjoyed this topic have shown lots of enthusiasm and engagement throughout.





### Year 3 Owl And Raptor Visit

On Tuesday 8th October, we had a very special visit from Dan and the owls from the Owl and Raptor Centre. We enjoyed watching the owls as they flew over our heads, whilst Dan explained lots of facts about them and in particular the barn owl, which we've been reading in our story about "The Owl who was afraid of the dark."

We met Hayes the barn owl (photo underneath), Eileen the tawny owl and Bindy and Zazu. Dan said that the children were amazing with their knowledge of facts, and also how well behaved they had all been. Well done, Year 3!
