

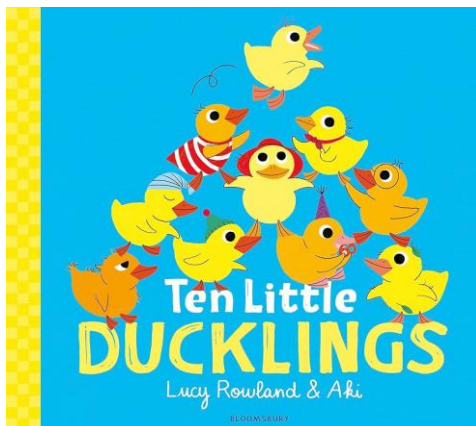
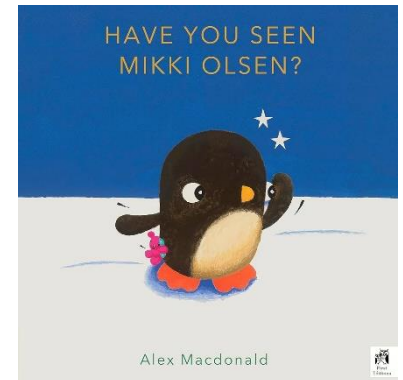


Winklebury Federation Spring Term 2025 Book Recommendations

Spring into reading!

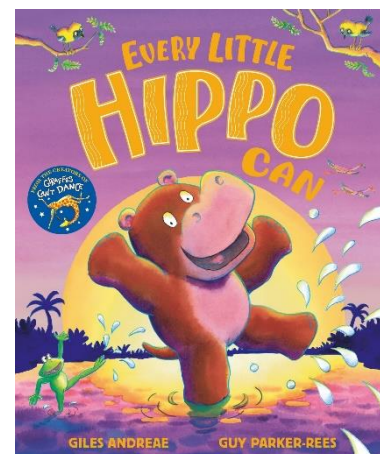
Picture books

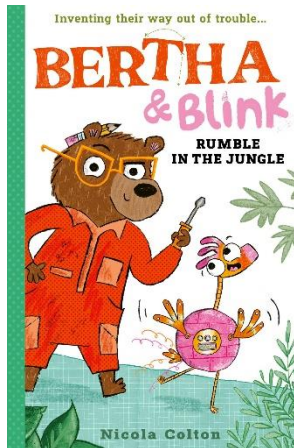

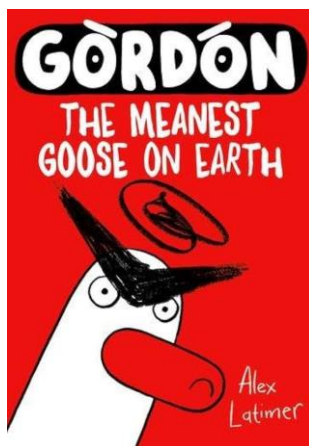
Chapter books for younger readers

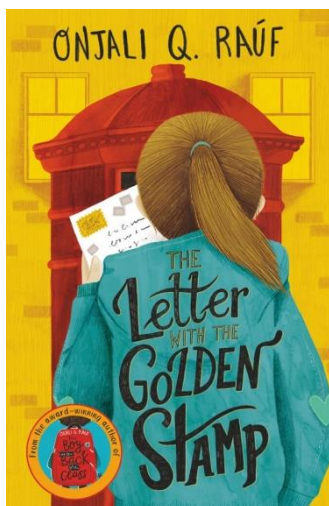
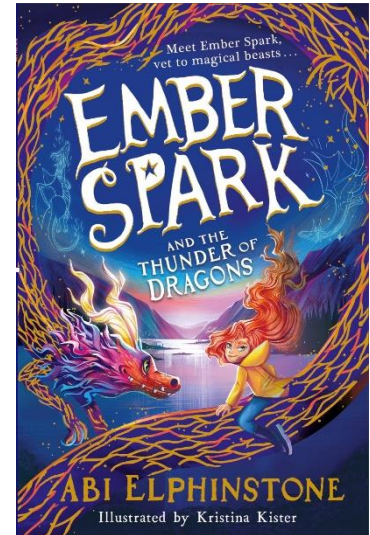

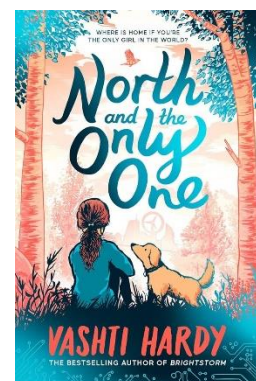
Chapter books for older readers

Money is tight and when her mum's health worsens, Audrey decides to contact her dad for help.
